Our Class Instructions:

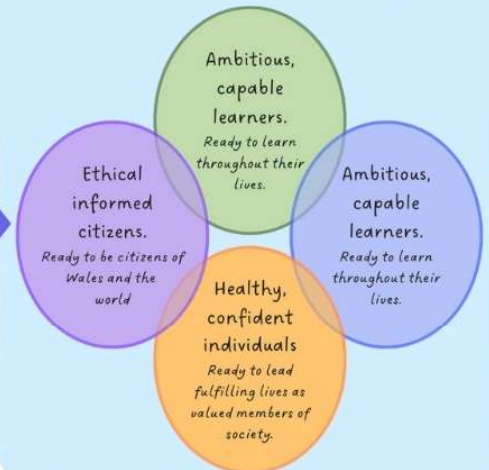
- Listen to the teachers and each other carefully.

Context for Learning:

During this term we will be learning through our themes of Movers & Shakers, Portraits & Poses and Celebrations

The Movers & Shakers Context teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.
