Context for Learning:

Big Wide World

Once Upon a Time

We will learn about-

- Countries around the world, thinking about the people, cultures and animals that live in these places.
- Retelling, sequencing and acting out familiar and traditional tales including stories such as *Cinderella*, *Goldilocks*, *Little Red Riding Hood*, *The Three Little Pigs* and *The Three Billy Goats Gruff*.
- Thinking about characters, settings and events in traditional tales / stories, including those from different countries.
- Literacy – Using and extending our letter / sound knowledge to build and record words. Recognising and recording simple keywords. Combining these skills to record sentences.
- Maths & Numeracy -Further developing number recognition, recording, counting, sequencing. To make sensible estimates, solve number sentences using the processes of addition and subtraction. 3D shapes, repeating patterns, measuring height, length, mass with non-standard measures and making use of comparative language. Using marks, numbers or pictures when collecting and recording data.
- Using ICT to - present information in a pictograph, practise mouse control and reinforce learning in other areas of learning.
- Music and how it creates atmosphere (linked to traditional tales).
- Maps and locating famous Welsh castles. Naming parts of a castle.
- Welsh vocabulary and sentence patterns such as *Beth sy'n bod*, *Beth wyt ti'n wneud* / *eisiau* and *Beth wyt ti'n hoffi*, allowing us to introduce and reinforce vocabulary around body parts, clothes and food.
