What Does 'Safeguarding' Mean?

Safeguarding simply means keeping children safe – in school, at home, and in the community

- Safeguarding includes protecting children from abuse, harm, or neglect, helping them stay healthy and happy
- Teaching them how to keep themselves safe
- Making sure the adults who work with them in school are suitable and trained
- Everyone has a part to play – school staff, parents, carers, and the wider community



Our Safeguarding Principles

- Every child has the right to feel safe, secure, and respected.
- Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.
- Concerns are always taken seriously and acted upon quickly
- We work closely with parents, carers, and partner agencies

How We Keep Children Safe

- We follow national and local guidance, including the Welsh Government's "Keeping Learners Safe" document and our own Child Protection Policy
- We create a caring and safe environment where children can thrive
- We talk to children about staying safe and who they can turn to for help,
- All staff are trained every year in safeguarding and child protection
- We work closely with families and other professionals to support children
- We make sure all adults in school are safely recruited and properly checked.
